To the Alfredton Community,

As you may be aware, Alfredton School have been working hard over the last year establishing a native garden and wetland. Currently, were have just over 400 plants that have settled into the area beautifully. This year, the aim is to bulk up some of the native grasses and add a few mature trees for impact in the area. After consulting with Sarah Falloon from Horizons' Regional Council, we have put together a list of tree species found in our area and likely to do well in our space.

The BOT of Alfredton School are giving the wider community an opportunity to purchase a tree to be planted in the garden. All trees purchased will come with a metal tag on which we will have the family name of the donors and the year it was planted.

The trees will be ordered via Leaf Land nursery in Palmerston North. I will see that the native garden will be prepared for their planting and in the winter, we hope to organise a small planting day in which anyone who would like to be involved can be.

If you are viewing this letter digitally, the blue scientific names on the form are links to the Leaf Land profile of each tree. Over the next few years, we are aiming to plant 15 trees, and probably no more than 20. A variety would be ideal. Feel free to get in touch if you would like some guidance of which species to choose.

If you know of anyone who you think would like to purchase a tree, feel free to let them know and pass on this letter. It could be a good option to include extended family in your tree order. One tree could be donated by multiple generations within a family if preferred.

As we would like to give ourselves the best chance of fulfilling the order to suit everyone's preferences, please return your order form to the Alfredton School office, or to myself by Friday 10th March. You are welcome to email these directly to kate@alfredton.school.nz. Apologies for the short notice period!

We would appreciate payment at the time of the order and the school payment details are below.

This is a big expense for donors so please do not feel any pressure to purchase a tree, and if it doesn't suit this year, know that this is likely to be offered again in years to come. There are many other ways you can, and already have contributed to the Native Garden and Wetland.
