This week children in Huia class took questionnaires home asking for help to discover their own family's migration stories. Please can they be returned Monday, at the latest. As part of the Ministry's work to improve school attendance data is being collected about numbers of children who don't have a reason given for their absence. If your child is not going to be at school please contact the school office either via phone or email. Please remember to say why they are absent. If you don't contact us / don't give a reason ? or T is entered on the roll. These are both classed as truant. Persistent truancy will result in a visit from the Attendance Officer.

We are aiming for attendance of 90% or greater. If attendance falls below 80%, unless there is a good reason (usually medical) the Attendance Officer may call to find out why your child is regularly missing school and how they can support them to attend more regularly. We are pleased that 70% of our children have attendance above 85% with 48% above 90%. It would be great to have 80% of our children above 85% attendance by the end of term 2.

We have three events coming up soon. On Wednesday 24th May our Year 8's (with Mr G) will be attending the National Young Leaders' Day in Palmerston North. On Tuesday 30th May the majority of Huia class will be taking part in the Tough Guy and Gal Challenge at Massey University and then on Wednesday 31st the whole school will be taking part in the Rural Schools Road Race at the stadium in Pahiatua. Please look out for letters regarding transport which will be coming home next week. Have a great week.
